Welcome to this year's Impact Report

2021/22 has been a busy year for Community Action Sutton, we continue to work with our partners and stakeholders and ensure our 271 members are supported to carry on the valuable work they do.

During 2021/22 our work initially focused on supporting organisations and small groups to recover and rebuild as we all got to grips with hybrid working.

We kept busy throughout the year as we continued our work with the Fairness Commission. We held a conference in October 2021, where we launched the highly anticipated Racial Justice Report, alongside a short animation explaining the background and importance of this piece of work. Weekly meetings continue, to ensure this work is not set aside.

We were excited to continue and develop further our work and projects at Hill House, especially the Community Garden Project, which is growing from strength to strength, quite literally! We continued to work with Sutton Housing Partnership and enjoyed setting up the Active Me exercise classes in the St Helier area. We were pleased to be able to support groups and individuals through the St Helier Community Fund, with £8000 being awarded to projects that benefited local residents.

Working closely with a host of local partners we held two extremely successful Job Fairs, seeing over 400 people through the doors at Hill House, all looking for either work, training or volunteering opportunities, we received excellent feedback from these events and were really pleased to support local residents.

One of our biggest pieces of work, happened behind the scenes, when we worked with the Sutton Together partnership to form a consortium to bid for the Making Informed Choices contract from the London Borough of Sutton. We are very pleased to say the consortium won this contract and work began on setting up the newly formed Together for Sutton service.

I look forward to working with our members, partners and stakeholders in the coming year.

Promoting equality and diversity

Racial Justice in Sutton

Over 30 people attended an event held in partnership with the Fairness Commission in October 2021. The highly anticipated Racial Justice in Sutton report was launched alongside a short animation explaining the background to the report.

Engaging Young People

8 young people from Sutton's Youth Independent Advisory Group (IAG) along with members from the Suttons IAG participated in a Hydra event in February 2022.

The event held in partnership with Bromley and Croydon Police, provided an immersive and interactive experience that gave young people the chance to watch simulated scenarios. Using video interviews, telephone recordings, emails, and radio and television news stories the groups had to give their feedback and record their decisions before finally discussing their findings with trained and skilled facilitators.

"I thought the hydra training was a great and effective training exercise to help us not only as members of the IAG but also as a community to understand how custody staff such as police officers often have a great deal to manage in often chaotic situations. I particularly enjoyed the focus of communication via social media platforms as it was something that was relatable to me and showed how as a youth I can raise awareness. Small Charity Week

39 people took part in a video sharing why they love small charities. During the week, we held a special 'Meet the Funder' event with a guest speaker from the National Lottery Community Fund.

International Women's Day

For International Women's Day 2022 we put together a short video featuring over 60 colleagues and partners standing together to strike the #BreaktheBias pose.



National Hate Crime Awareness Week

We worked with local partners to help provide information, offer support and raise awareness of Hate Crime in Sutton.

Over 30 people took part in our short video sharing messages to #SpreadLoveNotHate.



Trustees' Week

To mark Trustees' Week In 2021, we delivered; 3 training sessions, with 36 people attending the training and 11 completing an accredited course.

Organisations also shared messages expressing their gratitude and appreciation for their Trustees.

Inspiring Partnerships

Supporting residents to Make Informed Choices

Working with Sutton Charity partners we developed a consortium of organisations to bid for the London Borough of Sutton's Making Informed Choices contract. We were extremely pleased to have won the contract in February 2022. The contract worth £1.1m per annum is significant as it secures ongoing investment into Sutton's Voluntary and community Sector in uncertain times. As the lead partner for this contract we will be the main point of contact between the Council and the delivery partners. We were pleased to once again co-fund and work with partners to organise the Sutton Community Awards. The awards were streamed live on 23rd February 2022 and were hosted by comedian and actor Tim Vine. Over 150 nominations were submitted across the ten categories. Finalists shared stories about their work in the community via pre-recorded videos. We felt very proud this year, as the Sue Robson Trustee of the Year award, went to our very own Trustee Neil Frater, Congratulations again Neil!

During 2021/22 we hosted two successful Job Fairs (one in July 21 and one in October 21). A third Job Fair was held in March 2022, where Sutton Job Centre took the lead and we offered support.

Representing the Sector

We facilitate a number of meetings, forums and networks to ensure the Voluntary Sector has a voice in Sutton. The meetings provide an opportunity for sharing information; receiving news and updates and gives organisations a chance to comment on and influence local strategies and policies. During 2021/22 we continued to hold the majority of our meetings online. Key themes and discussions included;

- Advice and support
- Funding information

We advocated for the Voluntary and Charity Sector at 15 quarterly boards, committees and partnerships across the Borough.




Supporting the Sector

Supporting the Sector

During 2021/22 we continued to hold our training online and following the success of the accredited training we continued to deliver these courses. We found our Implementing Black Curriculum and Equality and Diversity training to be well attended. We will be carrying out a survey in 2022, to find out more about the training needs of the sector.



Supporting organsiations with Payroll

CPS Payroll continues to provide a fast, efficient and complete payroll service. Our payroll staff are friendly, helpful, competent and understand the needs of the voluntary sector and beyond. The service supports groups and Individuals some with just a single employee while others have up to 80 employees. Pension contributions are submitted on behalf of over 50 clients to their pension providers.



Developing a vibrant Sector

Anti Poverty Forum

The Forum continues to meet bi-monthly and membership has increased during 2021/22. It has become a good place to learn of what trends are developing and a good way to share resources. The main aim of the Forum is to take action for example holding job fairs and writing a letter on the impact of the cost of living crisis to request action from London Borough of Sutton and other partners.

Men in Shed's

The Men in Shed's project started in 2020 and has gone from strength to strength, engaging on average 20 men per session. Activities throughout 2021/22 include;

- Physical and sport well-being sessions
- DIY activities and Wellbeing workshops
- Health and prostate cancer checks through the Man Van project

Setting up a Community Garden

At the Start of 2022, we began fundraising to set up a community garden in the grounds of Hill House, with funding secured the set up work started. The community garden now has regular volunteers that enjoy both the physical and mental aspects of gardening. Refreshments are provided, so volunteers can sit and have a well earned break and enjoy the social side of the project. This year has seen a very fruitful harvest, and extensions to the garden are being carried out.









Developing a vibrant Sector

Healthwatch Sutton

We continue to provide hosting, management and operational support to Healthwatch Sutton.

This year Healthwatch Sutton has;

- Published a new report highlighting problems local people are having accessing NHS dental services.
- Surveyed over 3,000 people to understand their experience of GP services
- Sent out a monthly email newsletter to over 250 local people and organisations, and worked in collaboration with local NHS communications staff
- Continued to support Patient Participation Groups (PPGs) at local GP surgeries, as well as the Patient Reference Group (PRG) to communicate with local commissioners. This work is funded by NHS Sutton.
- Engaged with and supported over 1,600 people on topics including mental health and Covid-19




Our finances

As at 31 March 2022, Community Action Sutton held £1,888,206 in unrestricted and restricted funds. The total value of unrestricted funds as at 31 March 2022 stands at £424,801 and the total value of restricted funds stands at £1,463,405. These are funds overseen by Community Action Sutton relating to specific projects and are accounted for separately, as required by the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP).
